

SUSS STUDY GRANT (FOR FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATES)

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. The SUSS Study Grants are open to all new and current full-time undergraduates (except Law students).
- 2. Applicants must be Singapore Citizens or Permanent Residents with financial needs and must achieve at least a cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.0 at point of study grant application.
- 3. The value of the study grant is \$\$1,000 per award for full-time undergraduates. It is awarded based on applicant's Gross Monthly Household Per Capital Income (PCI)1 or Monthly Gross Household Income (GHI)².
- Study grant recipients are not required to serve a bond with SUSS but are expected to make satisfactory academic progress.
- 5. Prospective students must separately seek admission to the programme and must be accepted for admission before being awarded the study grant.
- Study grants are accorded on a yearly basis. Applicants may apply for the study grant in the academic year that they are in need.
- 7. The study grant may not, without the prior approval of the University, be held concurrently with any other awards.
- 8. Applicants are required to submit all relevant supporting documents together with the study grant e-application. Otherwise, the application would be considered incomplete and will not be processed.
- Study grant application must be submitted by the stipulated deadline. Recipients are not allowed to request for deferment of the study grant.
- 10. The University reserves the right to revoke the study grant at any time if, in its opinion, the recipient's conduct or academic performance has not been satisfactory.
- 11. The University reserves the right to amend the terms and conditions for the study grant at its sole discretion without prior notice.

¹PCI refers to gross monthly household Per Capita Income (PCI) and is computed based on GHI divided by the number of immediate and non-immediate family members living in the same household.

²GHI refers to gross monthly household income of immediate and non-immediate family members, where: For Unmarried Students:

Immediate family members include parents who may or may not be living together with the student. Nonimmediate family members include grandparents, siblings, spouses of siblings, siblings of parents, and any other relatives living together with the student.

For Married Students:

Immediate family members include spouse and all children who may or may not be living together with the student. Non-immediate family members include parents, grandparents, siblings, spouses of siblings, siblings of parents, and any other relatives living together with the student.
