

## SUSS STUDY GRANT (FOR PART-TIME UNDERGRADUATES)

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- 1. The various Study Grants are open to all new and current part-time undergraduates.
- 2. Applicants must be Singapore Citizens or Permanent Residents with financial needs and must achieve at least a cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.0 at point of study grant application.
- 3. The value of the study grant is S\$500 per award for part-time undergraduates and will be used to offset the tuition fee of the following semester. It is awarded based on applicant's Gross Monthly Household Per Capital Income (PCI)<sup>1</sup> or Monthly Gross Household Income (GHI)<sup>2</sup>.
- 4. Study grant recipients are not required to serve a bond with SUSS but are expected to make satisfactory academic progress.
- 5. Prospective students must separately seek admission to the programme and must be accepted for admission before being awarded the study grant.
- 6. Study grants are accorded on a semester basis. Applicants may apply for the study grant in the academic semester that they are in need.
- 7. The study grant may not, without the prior approval of the University, be held concurrently with any other awards.
- 8. Applicants are required to submit all relevant supporting documents together with the study grant e-application. Otherwise, the application would be considered incomplete and will not be processed.
- 9. Study grant application must be submitted by the stipulated deadline. Recipients are not allowed to request for deferment of the study grant.
- 10. The University reserves the right to revoke the study grant at any time if, in its opinion, the recipient's conduct or academic performance has not been satisfactory.
- 11. The University reserves the right to amend the terms and conditions for the study grant at its sole discretion without prior notice.

<sup>1</sup>PCI refers to gross monthly household Per Capita Income (PCI) and is computed based on GHI divided by the number of immediate and non-immediate family members living in the same household.

<sup>2</sup>GHI refers to gross monthly household income of immediate and non-immediate family members, where:

## For Unmarried Students:

Immediate family members include parents who may or may not be living together with the student. Non-immediate family members include grandparents, siblings, spouses of siblings, siblings of parents, and any other relatives living together with the student.

## For Married Students:

Immediate family members include spouse and all children who may or may not be living together with the student. Non-immediate family members include parents, grandparents, siblings, spouses of siblings, siblings of parents, and any other relatives living together with the student.
